

Crowned league champions in 1954, the advent of the floodlit age provided an opportunity for the team to test itself against some of the best sides in the world. Most celebrated was the visit of Honvéd, a team boasting six of the Hungary players who had humbled England at Wembley the year before. Wolves' win restored national pride and led some to hail them 'champions of the world'. Out of the debate that followed, the European Cup was born.
