

Born in Scotland but raised in Yorkshire, David dreamed of swapping his job as a Doncaster coal-miner for a career in professional football. Not only did he achieve this, but he played at the highest level for clubs such as Chelsea, Coventry City, Blackburn Rovers, Liverpool and Leicester City. Whilst at Chelsea, Speedie became the first player since Geoff Hurst to score a hat-trick at Wembley. He also achieved promotion to the top flight with Chelsea, Blackburn, West Ham (while on loan from Southampton) and Leicester City. To put the icing on the cake, he played for Scotland ten times. David is brutally honest about the people he encountered in his long footballing career, and speaks candidly about his battle with depression after retiring from football and how he overcame it. This gripping book is a must-read for anyone interested in the English game in the 1980s or the Scotland national team of that era.
