INTRODUCTION

A club like Liverpool have a strong tendency to mess up questions by winning something in the gap between the production of the quiz and its publication. Anything that they do after the 2021/22 season is outside my control!

As with earlier books in this series, I've used the term 'League Cup' to describe the competition that began in 1960 and has sailed under numerous banners since that date.

Many of you will think me slightly crazy to have omitted Mo Salah from the 'Liverpool Legends' section, but as a rule I've not picked current players, and the gap between writing and publication has meant that many of his extraordinary performances came too late. However, there's not much doubt that he's one of the most outrageously gifted players to appear for the club.

ACROSS THE GREAT DIVIDE

The title of that track from The Band's magnificent 'brown' album sums up the fact that not too many players down the years cross Stanley Park to join the other lot. Here are ten players who have worn the red and the blue. Can you name them?

- 1. He played for Everton from 1970 to 1972 before a move to Ipswich Town. He rocked up at Liverpool in 1976 and stayed over five years, playing 148 league games and becoming top scorer in 1979/80 with 21 goals before returning to Goodison Park in the early 1980s.
- 2. All clubs make mistakes and Liverpool certainly did when they let this left-sided forward go to their neighbours in 1982. He had scored for the Reds against both Exeter City and Middlesbrough as they made their way to the League Cup Final of 1981/82. He went on to play 274 games for the Toffees, landing a European Cup Winners' Cup medal into the bargain.
- 3. This man played in 109 league games in Liverpool's defence before short spells at Derby County and Hull City. He returned to Merseyside with Everton in 1992, appearing in 128 league games before joining Birmingham City.
- 4. Everton had the best years of this goalscorer who got 78 goals in 91 games for them between 1889 and 1894. He then moved across to Anfield where he scored 14 times in 39 games.
- 5. Perhaps the most celebrated of all those who have represented both clubs, this classy forward played 131 times for Liverpool between 1989 and 1991, before trading his red shirt for a blue one and going on to play 81 times for Everton.
- 6. This combative midfielder turned out for Everton in 100 league games between 1980 and 1983. He came to Anfield from Aston Villa in 1985 and enjoyed great success in his 204 league matches with the club before departing for Manchester City in 1991. Particularly memorable were his fiery duels with Peter Reid in the derbies.

- 7. He was a quirky, clever left-winger who made 36 appearances for Liverpool before becoming a key member of the Everton title-winning sides of 1964 and 1970. He holds an entry in Jack Charlton's 'little black book' and could mix it when he needed to, and sometimes when he didn't!
- 8. The only player to be capped post-war for England while with both clubs, he had 116 outings for Everton between 1996 and 2000, before having another 32 with Liverpool between 2000 and 2002.
- 9. He scored 38 times in 222 games for Liverpool between 1948 and 1956 before turning out a handful of times for Everton in the 1956/57 season.
- 10. This guy liked nothing more than a good battle with a centre-half, and there's a great photo of him on the front cover of Jon Henderson's book *When footballers were skint*. After two spells at Everton that ended up with him scoring 95 goals in 225 games, he scored another 37 in 60 appearances for Liverpool between 1959 and 1961.

ANFIELD

- 1. Accrington were the first visitors to Anfield in the newly formed Football League on 8 September 1888 when they lost 2-1 to Everton. Who were Liverpool's first visitors in Division Two of that league five years and one day later after they had taken over tenancy of the ground?

- 4. In 1906 a vast cinder bank was built behind one of the goals. It was called the 'Spion Kop' by journalist Ernest Edwards as a tribute to the men of the Lancashire Fusiliers who died in the battle of that name in 1900. In which war?
- 5. Why were 40,149 supporters at Anfield on 11 March 1967 when Liverpool weren't at home?
- 6. The record attendance at the ground was set on 2 February 1952 at 61,905 in a fourth-round FA Cup tie in which they defeated which club 2-1?
- 7. Anfield was used for an FA Cup semi-final between Cardiff City and Wolves in 1921, which was attended by George V and Queen Mary. What brought them to that neck of the woods?
- 8. The open Kop received a roof in 1928 and became the stuff of legend in the 1960s through intensive media interest in Merseyside due to the club's success and the Beatles phenomenon. There was even an absurd BBC TV programme called *Kop Choirs* in which people voted for competing supporters of different clubs. Who hosted it?

- 9. The end came for the Kop in 1994 when, in polite terminology, it was redeveloped. Some locals would have used the word 'destroyed' instead. Which club were the last to visit on 30 April 1994, spoiling the day into the bargain by winning 1-0?
- 10. Who, with a penalty in a 1-0 win over Ipswich Town on 9 April 1994, had the privilege of being the player to score the last Liverpool goal on the ground before it was changed forever?

- 8. What is the connection between a player signed from Fulham in 1977 who moved to Luton Town in 1982 and another player who left Liverpool for Manchester City in 2015?
- 9. Liverpool had two players in the 1890s with palindromic surnames, both going by the name of Hannah. They had none in the 20th century, but have had another in this one. Who is it?
- 10. A member of the Liverpool FA Cup Final team of 1950 shares his surname with a member of the Liverpool team in the 1971 FA Cup Final. Both games were against Arsenal. What is that surname?

AWAY FROM ANFIELD - PART 1

All these post-war Liverpool players appeared in a domestic cup final after leaving Liverpool. Can you name them?

- This forward was at Anfield from 1953 to 1959 before joining Blackburn Rovers in time to play in their losing FA Cup Final against Wolves in 1960.
- 2. This goalkeeper came from Burnley in 1962 before moving on to Arsenal and playing in the side that lost 1-0 to Leeds United in the 1968 League Cup Final.
- 3. This Liverpool front man came to the club in 1991, before leaving the following year. He was a member of the Aston Villa side that beat Manchester United 3-1 in the 1994 League Cup Final.
- 4. He wasn't the only member of that Villa side that had previously been at Liverpool. Which defender also fits the bill?
- A Liverpool stalwart, he left the club in 1981 and was part of the Brighton team that lost after a replay to Manchester United in the 1983 FA Cup Final.
- 6. This great Liverpool goalkeeper who was at the club from 1905 to 1912 went on to win the FA Cup with Aston Villa in 1913 and 1920.
- 7. This Liverpool captain who left for Wolves after great service to the club was rewarded when the Midlands club won the League Cup in 1980.
- 8. After winning his fair share of medals at Anfield, he went south in 1981 and won the FA Cup with Spurs in 1982.
- 9. Having been at Liverpool between 1969 and 1974, he turned up at Nottingham Forest in the 1978 League Cup Final against his old club and won after a replay.
